

## NetMap Types of Users

NetMap recognizes three types of users for sustaining the community-based system (for NetStream and Universal Stream Layer, see below):

1) Public agencies, universities, and NGOs (non profit). (A) When commissioning new watershed coverage, there is full access to all analysis tools, GIS databases and reference materials. (B) In areas of existing NetMap coverage, there is full access to all analysis tools, GIS databases and reference materials.

2) Private (for profit) companies: (A) When commissioning new watershed coverage, there is full access to all analysis tools, GIS databases and reference materials. (B) In areas of existing watershed coverage and in areas where NetMap was used in a watershed assessment (in which the company participates), there is full access to all analysis tools, GIS databases and reference materials in those areas encompassed by the watershed assessment. (C) In areas of existing watershed coverage and not covered under a NetMap-supported watershed assessment, access to databases and tools allowed through collaborative efforts to improve database accuracy. Access also available by permission.

3) Private consulting companies. (A) When commissioning new watershed coverage, there is full access to all analysis tools, GIS databases and reference materials for the duration of the study in the project area. (B) In areas of existing watershed coverage, access is allowed through collaborative efforts to improve database accuracy. Access also available by permission.
